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# Basic Definitions

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## PUT (Base Form)

- **Core Meaning:** To place, set, or move something to a particular position or location
- **Grammar Function:** Base form used for simple present tense (except 3rd person singular), past tense, imperative mood, infinitive
- **Pronunciation:** /pʊt/

## PUTTING (Present Participle/Gerund)

- **Core Meaning:** The action of placing; the process or act of putting
  - **Grammar Function:** Present participle (for continuous tenses), gerund (as subject, object, etc.), present participle (as adjective or adverb)
  - **Pronunciation:** /'pʊtɪŋ/
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# Pronunciation Guide

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## PUT Pronunciation Details

- **Phonetic:** /pʊt/
- **Features:**
  - Short vowel /ʊ/ - brief "oo" sound like in "book"
  - Single syllable word, pronounced short and strong
  - Clear final /t/ sound is essential

## PUTTING Pronunciation Details

- **Phonetic:** /'pʊtɪŋ/
- **Features:**

- Two-syllable word: PU-tting
- Stress on first syllable /'pʊt/
- Second syllable /ɪŋ/ - "ing" sound

Practice Tips

1. **Mirror Practice:** Watch your mouth shape to ensure clear /t/ sound
2. **Rhythm Training:** PU-tting (stress-light), PUT (single syllable)
3. **Comparison Practice:** put - putting, cut - cutting, shut - shutting
4. **Recording Comparison:** Record your pronunciation and compare with standard audio

Spelling Rules: Putting vs Putting

⚠ Important Spelling Rules

- **Correct Spelling:** **PUTTING** (double t)
- **Incorrect Spelling:** **PUTING** (single t)

Spelling Rules Table

Rule Type	Rule Explanation	Example	Common Mistake
Short Vowel + Consonant	Single-syllable verbs ending in short vowel + consonant double the final consonant when adding -ing	put → <b>putting</b>	puting ❌
Long Vowel No Doubling	Verbs ending in long vowel or diphthong don't double when adding -ing	eat → eating	eaating ❌

Rule Type	Rule Explanation	Example	Common Mistake
Double Consonants No Doubling	Verbs ending in two consonants don't double when adding -ing	help → helping	helppping ✗
W, Y, X Ending	Verbs ending in w, y, x don't double when adding -ing	fix → fixing	fixxing ✗

## Verbs That Double (Short Vowel + Single Consonant)

- put → **putting** ✓
- get → **getting** ✓
- run → **running** ✓
- sit → **sitting** ✓
- stop → **stopping** ✓
- swim → **swimming** ✓

## Verbs That Don't Double (Long Vowel/Double Consonants)

- eat → **eating** ✓
- sleep → **sleeping** ✓
- help → **helping** ✓
- work → **working** ✓
- play → **playing** ✓
- fix → **fixing** ✓

## Memory Tips

- **CVC Rule:** Consonant-Vowel-Consonant pattern requires doubling
- **Short Vowel Recognition:** The /ʊ/ in "put" is short, so double the t
- **Rhyme Memory:** putting, getting, running, sitting all double

- **Contrast Memory:** eating (long vowel) vs putting (short vowel)

# Grammar Functions

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Grammar Function	PUT Usage Examples	PUTTING Usage Examples
<b>Subject</b>	- (Cannot be subject)	<b>Putting</b> effort into work is important.
<b>Object</b>	- (Cannot be object)	I enjoy <b>putting</b> puzzles together.
<b>Predicative</b>	- (Cannot be predicative)	My hobby is <b>putting</b> collections in order.
<b>Attributive</b>	- (Cannot be attributive)	The <b>putting</b> green in golf requires precision.
<b>Adverbial</b>	- (Cannot be adverbial)	<b>Putting</b> on his coat, he left the house.

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## Usage Scenarios

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### Daily Life Scenarios

**PUT:** - I **put** my keys in my pocket. - She **puts** the milk in the refrigerator. - They **put** the baby to bed at 8 PM.

**PUTTING:** - I am **putting** my clothes on. - She was **putting** makeup on when I called. - The kids are **putting** toys away.

### Business Work Scenarios

**PUT:** - We **put** the proposal on the agenda. - He **puts** extra hours into this project. - The company **put** new policies in place.

**PUTTING:** - I am **putting** together a presentation. - They are **putting** pressure on us to finish. - She is **putting** forward new ideas.

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# Common Errors and Corrections

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## Error Type 1: Tense Confusion

**Wrong:** I putting the book on the table. **Correct:** I am putting the book on the table.

**Explanation:** Continuous tense needs auxiliary verb be + -ing form

## Error Type 2: Third Person Singular

**Wrong:** He put the books away every day. **Correct:** He puts the books away every

day. **Explanation:** Simple present tense third person singular needs -s

## Error Type 3: Past Tense Misuse

**Wrong:** I am put the book on the table yesterday. **Correct:** I put the book on the table yesterday. **Explanation:** Past tense doesn't need be verb, use past form directly

### Learning Tips

- **Time Markers:** "now, right now, at the moment" usually use putting (continuous)
  - **Time Markers:** "yesterday, last week, ago" usually use put (past)
  - **Habitual Actions:** "always, usually, every day" choose put or puts based on subject
  - **Commands:** Only use put (imperative): "Put your homework on my desk."
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## Rich Examples

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### PUT Rich Example Collection

**Basic Usage:** - I **put** my phone on silent mode during meetings. - She **puts** her heart into everything she does. - We **put** the furniture in the living room. - The company **put** him in charge of the project.

**Idiomatic Expressions:** - Don't **put** all your eggs in one basket. - I can't **put** my finger on what's wrong. - She really **put** her foot in her mouth at the party. - Let's **put** our heads together and solve this problem.

## PUTTING Rich Example Collection

**Continuous Tense Usage:** - I am **putting** the final touches on my essay. - They were **putting** up decorations for the party. - She is **putting** a lot of effort into learning Chinese. - The team is **putting** together a new marketing strategy.

**Gerund Usage:** - **Putting** things off until tomorrow is a bad habit. - Thank you for **putting** in so much effort. - **Putting** yourself in someone else's shoes helps build empathy. - He is good at **putting** ideas into practice.

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## Phrasal Verbs Comparison

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Phrasal Verb	PUT Form Usage	PUTTING Form Usage	Meaning
<b>put off</b>	I <b>put off</b> the meeting.	I am <b>putting off</b> the meeting.	Postpone, delay
<b>put on</b>	She <b>put on</b> her coat.	She is <b>putting on</b> her coat.	Wear, add
<b>put up</b>	They <b>put up</b> a tent.	They are <b>putting up</b> a tent.	Erect, provide accommodation
<b>put away</b>	He <b>put away</b> the toys.	He is <b>putting away</b> the toys.	Store, save
<b>put down</b>	I <b>put down</b> my pen.	I am <b>putting down</b> my thoughts.	Place down, write
<b>put out</b>	The fireman <b>put out</b> the fire.	The fireman is <b>putting out</b> the fire.	Extinguish, publish

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# Tense Comparison

Tense	PUT Usage	PUTTING Usage	Time Markers
<b>Simple Present</b>	I <b>put</b> the books on the shelf. He <b>puts</b> his phone away.	- (Not used)	every day, always, usually
<b>Present Continuous</b>	- (Not used)	I <b>am putting</b> the books away. He <b>is putting</b> his phone away.	now, right now, at the moment
<b>Simple Past</b>	I <b>put</b> the books on the shelf yesterday.	- (Not used)	yesterday, last week, ago
<b>Past Continuous</b>	- (Not used)	I <b>was putting</b> the books away when he called.	while, when, at that time
<b>Simple Future</b>	I will <b>put</b> the books on the shelf.	- (Not used)	tomorrow, next week, soon
<b>Future Continuous</b>	- (Not used)	I will <b>be putting</b> the books away tomorrow.	this time tomorrow
<b>Present Perfect</b>	I have <b>put</b> the books on the shelf.	- (Not used)	already, yet, just
<b>Past Perfect</b>	I had <b>put</b> the books away before he came.	- (Not used)	before, after, by the time



## Tense Selection Tips

- **PUT**: Used for completed actions, habitual actions, past/future actions

- **PUTTING:** Only used for continuous tenses, indicating ongoing actions
  - **Gerund PUTTING:** Functions as noun, not restricted by tense
  - **Time Markers:** Keywords determine which form to use
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## Memory Tips & Learning Strategies





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### Mnemonic Memory Method

**Core Mnemonics:** - Put for placement, single action - Putting for ongoing, double t  
- Short vowel doubles, long vowel don't - CVC pattern doubles, check others carefully

**Tense Mnemonics:** - Simple tense uses put, continuous uses putting - Past uses put, present uses putting - Future will put, ongoing am putting

### Visual Memory Method

**Image Association:** - **PUT:** Imagine a completed action  - **PUTTING:** Imagine an ongoing action  - **Double T:** Imagine two "T"s like two people working together   
- **Pronunciation:** PU-tting stress on first syllable like drumming 

**Color Coding:** - Red - PUT (completed, past) - Blue - PUTTING (ongoing, present) - Green - Correct usage - Yellow - Error warning

### Practical Practice Methods

**Daily Practice:** 1. **Sentence Creation:** Create 5 sentences daily with put and putting 2. **Tense Conversion:** Change put sentences to continuous tense and vice versa 3. **Error Detection:** Find and correct common spelling and grammar errors 4. **Scenario Dialogue:** Simulate daily conversations using correct forms

### When to Use PUTTING:

-  Ongoing actions: "I am putting on my shoes."
-  As gerund (subject): "Putting effort is important."
-  As gerund (object): "I enjoy putting puzzles together."
-  Past ongoing: "She was putting makeup on."
-  Future ongoing: "I will be putting up decorations."

### Always Remember:

- **Spelling:** PUTTING (double T)  vs puting (single T) 

- **Pronunciation:** /pʊt/ vs /'pʊtɪŋ/
  - **CVC Rule:** Short vowel + consonant = double the consonant
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
